Background Why do we need a Climate Fund?

Amazon Basin – the largest and one of the most diverse rainforests in the world – is under threat

Rainforest now emitting more CO₂ than it absorbs!

Recent studies confirm that indigenous territories and national protected areas are essential for the preservation of the Amazon.

About half of the intact forest in Amazonia is located in indigenous territories – an area larger than France, Germany, Italy, Norway, Spain and the UK combined.





Without indigenous peoples there will be no rainforests in the future







Our indigenous partners in Amazonia are our most important allies

Together we can strengthen their rights and contribute to the protection of their territories and thus of the rainforests – with the Climate Fund of Climate Alliance!

- And much more!








Autonomous Territorial Government of the Wampís (GTANW), Peru

- 13,000 km²
- 16.000 inhabitants in 85 communities
- Storage of 145 million t of carbon
- equivalent to 522 million t CO₂e
- Absorption of 57 mio. t CO₂/year
- Water evaporation 34million I/day ("Flying rivers")
- Deforestation rate below 1



The first project in the Climate Alliance's Climate Fund
